#### c. Minor Courses: 27 credits.

Minor is not required, but if desired, is 27 credits, either in another program, or in the major; a student who does not have a minor must take 27 credits of general electives (any courses in the college).

#### d. Free Courses (PE): 18 credits.

Students MUST choose two courses from other divisions in the college and the divisions are Practicing and fine Arts division (Media studies and Literature and society) and Natural Sciences (Biology, Chemistry, and Computer Science), also students MUST choose one course in Social Sciences (Economics and finance, Human rights and international law, and Political Science).







Students to complete their free courses can choose zero to five additional free courses in any field in the college.

NOTE: Students can choose one course + Lab from natural science course.

### Section Three: Four Year Study Plan Summary

The student has to pass at least (128) credit hours to get B.SC Degree in Human Rights and International Law Program.
